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**Item 7.01 Regulation FD Disclosure**

On February 26, 2013, Chase Corporation (the Company) was notified that a trust for the benefit of an adult child of Peter R. Chase, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Company, of which Mr. Chase's spouse is trustee, entered into a pre-arranged stock trading plan to sell up to 25,000 shares of the Company's common stock. The stock trading plan will be adopted in accordance with the guidelines as specified under Rule 10b5-1 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the Company's policies regarding stock transactions.

Rule 10b5-1 permits insiders to implement written, pre-arranged stock trading plans when they are not in possession of material non-public information. These plans establish predetermined trading parameters that do not permit the person adopting the plan to exercise any subsequent influence over how, when, or whether to effect trades. Using these plans, insiders can gradually diversify their investment portfolios, spread stock trades out over an extended period of time to reduce market impact, and avoid concerns about transactions occurring at a time when they might possess inside information.

The stock trading plan will occur over a period commencing on April 1, 2013 and ending no later than September 30, 2013. The transactions under this stock trading plan will be disclosed publicly through required filings with the Securities and Exchange Commission.
